• Despite perennial rhetoric and data of "lost community"

- Community is rising
- Computer-supported community innovation has a 50 year history
- New opportunities abound



Community: Lost and Found

- The foundation of citizenship and society
- In conflict with mass society
- Perennially in crisis and slipping away

- Identity self, commitment, development
- Awareness/Participation engagement, collaboration
- Social Support multiplexed, highly brokered networks



Community is Rising

- New "givens" in municipal government
 - Letting the genie of democracy out of the bottle
- More adoption of existing innovative models
 - Worldwide growth of timebanking and volunteering
 - Co-production of social services, such as UK NHS timebank treatment for mood disorders
- New grass roots social innovation initiatives
 - Local/organic foods, co-working/co-spaces, crowd funding community development, co-labs for specific issues such as affordable housing, ...



Computer-Supported Community Innovation


- Not a new idea

- Integrate formal and informal community news
- Facilitate hyperlocal discussion/interaction

Alternative Currencies



- Network of emerging (converging) initiatives
- Local currencies, Timebanks, p2p collaborative microenterprises, cryptocurrencies
- Common factor: remove mediation of central entities (national governments, large corporations, banks)
- Expand concept of economic exchange



New Infrastructures



- Smart social grid
- Human sensors identify issues; organize/analyze through service aggregation
- Visioning → geoliberation → prioritizing
- Civic crowdfunding (via timebank)



Future Opportunities

- Neighborhood as living laboratory
 - An old idea (Park et al., 1925)
 - Unique opportunities, e.g., relative density of strong ties, place making, long-term & large scale PD, timebanks and local economy, smart social grids, ...)
- New ways of accessing people and cultivating markets (smart social grid infrastructures)
- Bottom-up transformation to more distributed
 framework for innovation/coordination
